Human fear manifests itself with hoarding. There are a small number of men who have control over much of this process I've described here. They are doing it for one reason: to hoard money, the goal of capitalism. There are television shows dedicated to showing the irrationality of "hoarders." Typically, they're poor people who cannot throw anything away - houses filled with newspapers, garbage and animal carcasses. This is no different than the hoarders of money, except the money hoarders' activities are affecting us all. This is the foundation of our current culture. The top of society has now developed the technology to go on a bender like no other. The bender is also known as *Anthropocene* era.
